











BACKGROUND

In recent decades, India's inland waters, and especially her rivers, have been exposed to various anthropogenic stresses. Many rivers are severely impacted as a result of channel and bank modifications, flow regulation and fragmentation, chemical and organic pollution, etc. Because of these misuses, several long reaches of rivers remain completely dry for large parts of the year. Consequently, flood plains are lost and river beds are even cultivated during dry periods. As a result of such habitat degradation, fish catches have greatly declined, the size of important indigenous fish species has decreased, and fish recruitment has been seriously affected.

The impact of human activities is already manifesting and is reflected by declining fisheries, increasing incidence of floods, lowered groundwater tables, and growing incidence of waterborne diseases. Since independence in 1947, India has witnessed rapid, unplanned urbanization in addition to industrialization and intensification of agriculture. As a consequence, the natural environment has deteriorated including the water quality of many Indian rivers and at a rapid pace. One of the major reasons for this is the release of untreated wastewater to the rivers. It is indeed a matter of concern that out of the world's 30 river basins identified as global level priorities for maintenance and protection of aquatic biodiversity, nine of these are Indian, namely: Brahmaputra, Cauvery, Ganges, Godavari, Indus, Krishna, Mahanadi, Narmada, Pennar, and Tapi. Organizing this conference is a collective effort of Inland Fisheries Society of India (IFSI), G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology (GBPUAT), Aquatic Ecosystem Health & Management Society (AEHMS), ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (CIFRI), and Professional Fisheries Graduate Forum (PFGF).

Inland Fisheries Society of India (IFSI), one of the oldest scientific societies in India, is celebrating its 50 years of scientific acumen and responsibility through partnering this conference. The Society promotes fisheries research and development in Asia. It regularly organizes national and international scientific events and has the distinction of uninterrupted publication of *Journal of the Inland Fisheries Society of India*, a leading journal in the field of fisheries, since 1969. In recent past, IFSI organized or participated in PAF congress on Public –Private Partnership in Aquaculture and culture Based Fisheries in 2013, 29th All India Congress of Zoology and International Symposium on Culture Based Fisheries in Inland Open Waters and International Satellite Symposium on Fish Immunology; National Seminar on Priorities in Fisheries and Aquaculture, and International Workshop on Bioinformatics in Fisheries and Aquaculture in 2017.

Govind Ballabh Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, also known as 'Pantnagar University', is the first agricultural university of India which pioneered the agricultural education in India and other countries and made the model for other agricultural universities. It is one of the best State Agriculture Universities with a sprawling campus and is regarded as the Harbinger of Green Revolution in the country.

Aquatic Ecosystem Health and Management Society (AEHMS) encourages and promotes holistic initiatives for the protection and conservation of global aquatic resources. The AEHMS has been actively engaged with aquatic researchers in India for almost two decades (since 2001). It regularly organizes seminars/conferences in different parts of the world on aquatic ecosystem health and management. In India, a special symposium was organized by the Society during the 8th Indian Fisheries Forum. It was a great opportunity for the Society to participate and organize a two-day symposium on "Health and fisheries of major river ecosystems of India with emphasis on River Ganga" in collaboration with ICAR-CIFRI under the aegis of the 100th Indian Science Congress (ISC) at Kolkata in January, 2013. Papers from this historical symposium during 100th ISC resulted in the publication of special issues of Aquatic Ecosystem Health & Management devoted to the Ganges and major rivers of India (AEHMS, 2013, 2017).

ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute is the first Institute in India in the field of inland fisheries research, extension and training. The Institute has an impressive track record of providing research support for the country's inland fisheries development since its inception in 1947. Technologies developed by the Institute have paved the way for aquaculture development and blue revolution,

sustainable production enhancement from reservoirs and wetlands, health management of rivers and associated ecosystems, fisheries resource assessment and database development, human resource

Do not include tables, figures, or citations/references in the abstract.

Selected presentations of the conference will be invited for submission of their full papers which will be considered for publication, subject to peer review, in a special issue of the ISI rated journal Aquatic Ecosystem Health and Management, or in the Journal of the Inland Fisheries Society of India.

REACHING PANTNAGAR

Pantnagar, the University town, is 250 km away from Delhi on the Delhi-Nainital highway and 350 km from Lucknow on the Lucknow-Nainital highway. Regular buses ply from ISBT (Anand Vihar) Delhi to Rudrapur, Haldwani and Nainital. Some buses may not come directly to Pantnagar but divert at Rudrapur, which is only 14 km away from Pantnagar. From Rudrapur, there is regular taxi service to Pantnagar between 7.00 AM to 8.00 PM. If informed well in advance, vehicle will be arranged to pick the delegates from Rudrapur. There is direct flight from Delhi and Dehradun to Pantangar.
